#### **BIOGRAPHY**

Louise Welsh is a high-acclaimed novelist and short story writer. She began her literary career writing crime fiction, and her debut novel, The Cutting Room (2002), was nominated for several literary awards including the Orange Prize for Fiction. More recently Louise has turned her attention to the dystopian genre. Her "Plague Times" trilogy takes place in a post-apocalyptic Britain suffering in the wake of a deadly pandemic virus. She has received numerous awards and international fellowships, including an Honorary Doctor of Arts from Edinburgh Napier University and an honorary fellowship from the University of Iowa's International Writing Program. Louise Welsh is Professor of Creative Writing at the University of Glasgow
